SITUATION:

Cornelius Pass Road will be closed for improvements this coming May-September. This will turn our somewhat quiet secondary roads into busy freeways. Let's do something positive.

PLAN:

Skyline Grange has a plan to perhaps encourage motorists to be more mindful that they are traveling in our curvy, wonderful neighborhood.

Think Burma Shave. From 1926-1963, the Burma Shave Company advertised its brushless shaving cream by putting up groups of 4-6 small signs along roadsides. These signs were humorous rhyming poems spaced for sequential reading by passing motorists. Some of the signs featured safety messages about speeding instead of advertisements. An example of a Burma-Shave sign is “Hardly a driver / Is now alive / Who passed / On hills / At 75 / Burma-Shave”.

SUBMIT YOUR JIGGLES: to skylinegrange894@msn.com.

1. Jiggle Criteria: should rhyme, be 4-5 short lines, humorous, and will have a message (ideally a punchline) to motorists.
2. Submit to skylinegrange894@msn.com.
3. Jiggles will be juried and the best selected.
4. DEADLINE for submission is Monday, February 25.
5. So far about 40 rhymes have been submitted.

OFFER YOUR ROADSIDE FRONTAGE TO HOST A JIGGLE

We would like to target Newberry, McNamee, Kaiser, Old Cornelius, Brooks, Logie Trail, and Skyline in particular. Signs need to be placed on private property adjacent to the road (not in the public right-of-way). Each jiggle would require about 60-100 feet of lineage in all. Locations need be free of obstruction (weeds/trees) and in a safe place (straight away) for motorists to read (e.g., not on a sharp curve).
