Garden of Eatin' - Vegetable Gardening Tips for Spring

Get your garden ready to grow. Learn steps that you can take now to ensure that your vegetable garden will be a success this summer. This talk will provide tips for selecting the best site for your garden, sampling and testing your soil, calculating the correct amount of fertilizer or lime to add based on the soil test results, making seed tape, growing your own transplants from seed, developing a planting plan that will yield year-round fresh produce and managing pests.

Dennis Brown, PhD, has had a lifelong interest in gardening and has been a Master Gardener since 2010. He currently gardens at his home and at nearby Cully Community Garden in Northeast Portland. In 2016 he replaced his lawn with a cornucopia of plants that provide food and beauty for his household as well as forage for pollinators and native birds. As an OSU Master Gardener, he provides research-based information on sustainable gardening practices to the public in metropolitan Portland via the Master Gardener phone line, farmers' markets plant clinics and other venues. He is on the Advisory Council for SolvePestProblems.org, a project of the Oregon State University Extension Service, which is developing an accessible tool for Oregonians to obtain information about safely managing pests in their gardens and homes. Dennis has degrees in Horticulture (BS, MS) and Plant Biology (PhD).

NW Rocky Point Road Slide Repair Update

A contractor working for Multnomah County is working to repair a landslide that has closed NW Rocky Point Road to through traffic between Highway 30 and NW Skyline Blvd. The repair involves excavating the slide, installing a new road base, adding a culvert uphill from the slide to direct stormwater away from the slide, and repaving the road. The road will reopen this spring, most likely in April.

Neighbors at each end of NW Rocky Point Road have access to their homes. Please note that no traffic is allowed in the work zone, which is under construction and crosses an active landslide. Our crews have had to stop vehicles in recent days that attempted to drive through the work zone. This is a risk to drivers and the crew working to repair the slide.

Elk alert for NW Cornelius Pass Road drivers

We don't often issue elk alerts for drivers, but we have one for you today.

A herd of about 30 elk are wandering the west hills this month near NW Cornelius Pass Road south of NW Skyline Blvd. Yesterday the herd was spotted in a field on the south side of the road near NW Kaiser Road. Apparently, the lead cow in the herd has died or left the group. The remaining herd has been wandering the hills a bit more than usual. Please be alert for these large animals when driving NW Cornelius Pass Road and nearby side roads, especially at night.
