### **RESPONDS TO A SHOOTING ON NW LOGIE TRAIL RD**

On March 29th, 2019 at approx. 6:55AM, Multnomah County Sheriff's Office with the assistance of Portland Police Bureau and Scappoose Police Department, were dispatched to a Shooting at the 19400 Block of NW Logie Trail RD off Highway 30.

An adult male was located at the scene with serious life threatening injuries. Lifesaving efforts were made, but the adult male died at the scene.

Detectives from the Major Crimes Team, which is comprised of members of the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office, the Gresham Police Department, and Oregon State Police, are on scene and are continuing to investigate.

Portland Police and Multnomah County Sheriff's Office located and identified all the

individuals connected with this incident and they are all safe.

This is an ongoing investigation, therefore we are not releasing the name of the deceased or any of the persons involved at this time

We would like to express to the community there is no threat to public.

MCSO would like to thank the Portland Police Bureau, Gresham Police Department, the Oregon State Police, and the Scappoose Police Department for their assistance in this case.

## **NW Newberry Road scheduled to reopen in April**

NW Newberry Road is expected to reopen to traffic in April after being closed for more than two years by a landslide. Contractor Tapani Inc. has been working to repair the road since this February. The contractor has excavated the slide by the road and is building a retaining wall made of rock-filled steel baskets to support the new road. The wall is anchored into the hillside. The road is expected to reopen in mid-April.

NW Newberry Road was one of several west hills roads north of Portland that were damaged by a major snowstorm in January 2017. A section of the road above Highway 30 became saturated by melted snow and slid into a canyon below. Multnomah County successfully pursued federal disaster funds for the \$1.8 million repair, which delayed construction until this year.

Work hours are from 7 am to dusk, Monday through Saturday, with occasional work on Sundays. The public should be aware that:

NW Newberry Road is closed to all traffic, including bicyclists and pedestrians, in the work zone near 13342 NW Newberry Road

Drivers using the section of NW Newberry Road below the work zone should be alert for dump trucks and heavy equipment accessing the work zone from Highway 30 on this steep, curving and narrow road

NW Newberry Road will be an important detour route for cars and pickup trucks when nearby NW Cornelius Pass Road closes to through traffic for 13 weeks starting in July. A contractor working for Multnomah County will construct a number of safety improvements on NW Cornelius Pass Road this summer. Multnomah County maintains the sections of NW Newberry Road and NW Cornelius Pass Road that will be repaired this year. For more information:
