What: "Invasion of Insects of Concern" Presentation
When: Wednesday, November 28, 2018
Time: 7 p.m.
Where: Skyline Grange, 11275 NW Skyline Blvd., Portland 97231



Details:

It is fall, and many of your homes again have been invaded by thousands of native box alder beetles and non-native brown marmorated stink bugs as they seek a warm place to overwinter. Come learn more about these insects and several others of concern. Chris Hedstom, entomologist from Oregon Department of Agriculture, will speak. In addition to the harmless, but extremely annoying Box Adler Beetle, his presentation will highlight Japanese Beetles, Asian Gypsy Moths, Azalea Lace Bugs, and the Brown Marmorated Stink Bug. These four insects have become a threat locally to beloved native and ornamental plants, fruits, and berries, and to Oregon agricultural production as a whole: This event is free and open to the public. (Note: Restrooms are accessible only by stairs.)
