October 8 public meeting on West Hills road projects
The public is invited to a meeting about three Multnomah County road projects scheduled in the West Hills in the next year. The meeting will be Monday, October 8 from 6 – 7:30 pm at Skyline Elementary School, 11536 NW Skyline Blvd.

The meeting will include a project team presentation to the Community Advisory Committee for the Cornelius Pass Road Safety Improvements which the public is invited to attend. The agenda will include:

- The construction schedule and traffic plan for NW Cornelius Pass Road improvements in 2019
- The construction schedule and traffic plan for a landslide repair on NW Germantown Road planned this October
- The construction schedule for a landslide repair on NW Newberry Road expected to start late this fall
