streams, and view (SEC-h, SEC-s & SEC-v) and Geologic Hazards (GH) DECISION: Approved with Conditions the request for a Lot of Record

Verification and SEC-v, a type 1 SEC-h, and GH Permits to replace a singlefamily dwelling and attached deck that were damaged by fire, and the review of the ground disturbance (retroactive and proposed) within the GH overlay. No development is proposed within the SEC-s overlay, therefore an SEC-s permit is not required for the project. This decision is final at the close of the appeal period, unless appealed. The deadline for filing an appeal is December 14, 2023 at 4 p.m.

OPPORTUNITY TO APPEAL The appeal form is available

at www.multco.us/landuse/application-materials-and-forms Appeal requires a \$250 fee and must state the specific legal grounds on which it is based. This decision is not appealable to the Land Use Board of Appeals until all local appeals are exhausted.

FIELD TRIP TO "ONCE A BRAIDED RIVER"

A disaster with the fuel tanks in Linnton along the Willamette would affect even those of us living on the "Ridge". Skyline Grange Education Committee is organizing a field trip to the showing of "Once a Braided River" so more Skyline Ridge area residents will be more informed. WHAT: Field trip to "Once a Braided River", a documentary film with filmmaker and panel discussion WHEN: Tuesday, December 5, 2023 TIME: 6:15 p.m. Carpool leaves from the Skyline Grange (11275 NW Skyline Blvd.) Movie starts @ 7 PM. WHERE: <u>St. John's Twin Cinemas</u>, 8704 N. Lombard **DETAILS**:

- Once a Braided River is a documentary movie about the lower Willamette River of today and what it was before it became home to the Critical Energy Infrastructure Hub. After the movie there will be a panel discussion.
- The CEI Hub is a 6-mile stretch of aging fuel tanks along Highway 30 on the Willamette River, just below Forest Park. Geologists anticipate this area will be subject to liquefication during an earthquake causing the soil under these tanks to act more like a liquid and spreading toward the Willamette River.


