Marcy Cottrell Houle will speak about the history and ecology of Forest Park on Thursday, February 22nd, 7PM, at Skyline Memorial Gardens (4101 NW Skyline Blvd -- use Gate 2 – see below). Marcy is a biologist who has studied the park for many years and the author of our favorite books about the park. She is an entertaining speaker and storyteller, as well as an advocate for Forest Park, and we are delighted to have her. Forest Park Conservancy will also be there (I think Marianne Wilburn, their interim Executive Director). After Marcy's talk, Marianne will tell us briefly about a PGE proposal to clear-cut 6 acres of mature forest canopy inside Forest Park. This evening is open to everyone, so invite your friends and neighbors.

Please use GATE 2 – this is the northern gate into Skyline Memorial Gardens, which will take you directly down to the parking lot. The building we meet in is next to the parking lot. There are markers at this entrance that say "Gate 2". If you use the other gate there is a long circuitous drive and you are likely to have difficulty finding us. Situated in the rugged hills west of downtown Portland, Forest Park is the nation's premier urban natural sanctuary. It supports essential habitat for hundreds of native plants and animals, including species at risk, and is one of the largest city parks in the world, offering miles of outstanding hiking trails within minutes of downtown. Forest Park is a rare treasure.

In the introduction to her most recent book, Forest Park: Exploring Portland's Natural Sanctuary, Marcy writes: "After studying Forest Park as an author and wildlife biologist for over four decades, my appreciation of its value only continues to grow...offering a place where our spirits can be touched by something greater than ourselves."

Marcy Cottrell Houle is a writer and wildlife biologist. Her books have been honored with the Christopher Award, the Oregon Book Award, the Oregonian's Best Books of the Northwest, and New York Times Best Books for Earth Day. Her books include One City's Wilderness: Portland's Forest Park, A Generous Nature: Lives Transformed by Oregon, The Gift of Caring: Saving Our Parents--and Ourselves--from the Perils of Modern Healthcare, Wings for My Flight: The Peregrine Falcons of Chimney Rock, and The Prairie Keepers: Secrets of the Zumwalt. She lives with her family in Portland.

February 13, 2024 For Immediate Release

The February meeting of the West Multnomah Soil & Water Conservation District (WMSWCD) Board of Directors will be held via Zoom on Tuesday, February 20, beginning at 6:00 p.m. We welcome the public to all District board meetings, and the meeting agenda allows time for public comment. Any person may attend the meeting and request to make public comment during the public comment period, comments are limited to two minutes maximum per person. A Zoom access code will be required to access the meeting. Interested participants may request the ID by emailing info@wmswcd.org with the subject line "Request for Conference ID" or by calling 503-238-4775 and leaving a voicemail message at extension 100, no later than 5:00 p.m. the day of the meeting.

The Board of Directors will begin with a <u>public hearing</u> regarding acquiring an easement for conservation purposes for the Sturgeon Lake restoration project. The board meeting will begin immediately after the public hearing and the board will vote on acquiring that easement, in resolution #2024-02-20A. This hearing and vote had been rescheduled from the January board meeting due to inclement weather. In addition, the board will appoint Budget Committee Members and discuss a possible change of accounting method. After, they are scheduled to vote on two more resolutions: #2024-02-20B, to adopt the revised employee handbook, and #2024-02-20C, to adopt revised public contracting rules. District Conservationists from National Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) will share work and partnership updates. Regular business to be covered at the board meeting includes approval of the prior month's board meeting minutes and review of the current financial reports. The agenda can be modified by the Board of Directors at any time during the meeting.

The Board of Directors typically meets on the third Tuesday of the month at 6:00 p.m. unless specified otherwise. The agenda for this meeting will be available for inspection on the <u>District's webpage</u> the morning of the meeting. 
