The March meeting of the West Multnomah Soil & Water Conservation District (WMSWCD) Board of Directors will be held via Zoom on Tuesday, March 15, beginning at 6:00 p.m. We welcome the public to all District board meetings, and the meeting agenda allows time for public comment. Any person may attend the meeting and request to make public comment during the public comment period. A Zoom access code will be required to access the meeting. Interested participants may request the ID by emailing info@wmswcd.org with the subject line "Request for Conference ID" or by calling 503-238-4775 and leaving a voicemail message at extension 100, no later than 5:00 p.m. the day of the meeting.

At this meeting, the Board of Directors will hear staff presentations of fiscal year 2022-2023 Annual Work Plans. Presentations will be aligned to Year 2 of the District's Long Range Business Plan (<https://wmswcd.org/people-places-things/the-west-multnomah-swcd/long-range-business-plan/>). The Long Range Business Plan is a strategic planning document that guides the scope of the District's conservation work and the supporting financial sustainability and organizational health initiatives needed to implement this work in 2021 to 2025. The board will also discuss whether to hold the April 19th Budget Committee and Board meetings in person or remotely. Regular business to be covered at the board meeting includes approval of the prior month's board meeting minutes and information on the previous month's financial reports. The agenda can be modified by the Board of Directors at any time during the meeting.

The Board of Directors typically meets on the third Tuesday of the month at 6:00 p.m., and due to COVID-19 restrictions, in lieu of meeting in-person, meetings will be held virtually via Zoom until further notice. Documents for this meeting will be available for inspection on the District's webpage (<https://wmswcd.org/people-places-things/people/board-meetings/>) the morning of the meeting. PROPOSAL: Applicant requests a Lot of Record Verification for the property. A Lot of Record Verification determines that a property was lawfully established in compliance with zoning and land division laws at the time of its creation or reconfiguration and the County's aggregation requirements. No development is proposed

DECISION The subject property known as 1N1W05B-00100 is not presently a Lot of Record, as an area of land within the subject property was not lawfully created.

OPPORUNITY TO APPEAL: The deadline for filing an appeal is Wednesday, March 22, 2022 at 4 p.m.

Comments should be directed toward approval criteria applicable to the request. An appeal requires a \$250 fee and must state the specific legal grounds on which it is based. To obtain appeal forms or info on the procedure, contact the Land Use Planning office. This decision is not appealable to the Land Use Board of Appeals until all local appeals are exhausted.

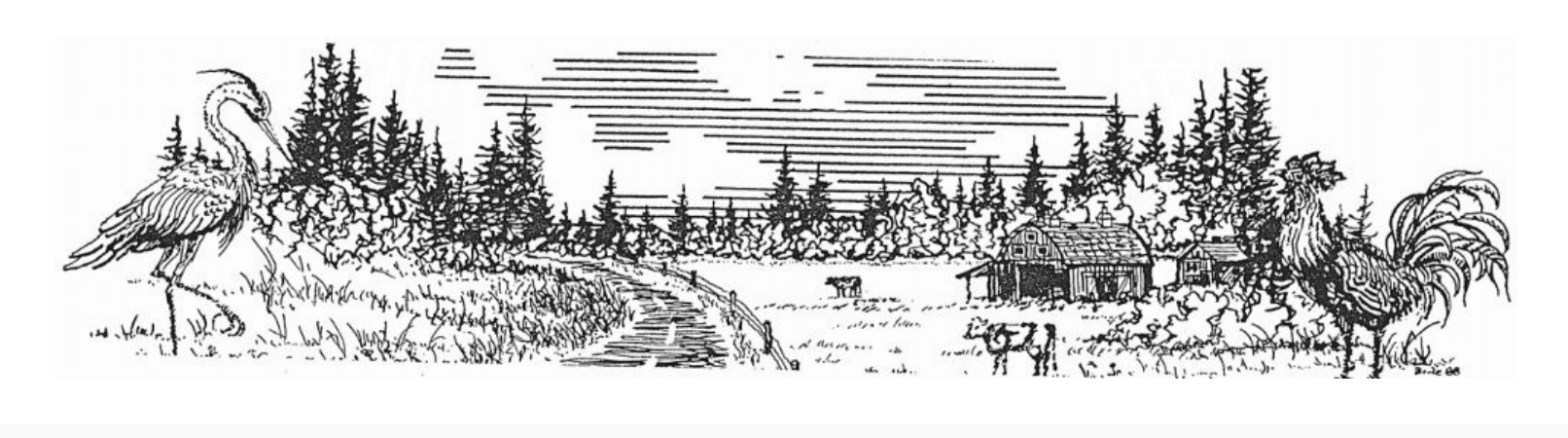
About the Newsline
