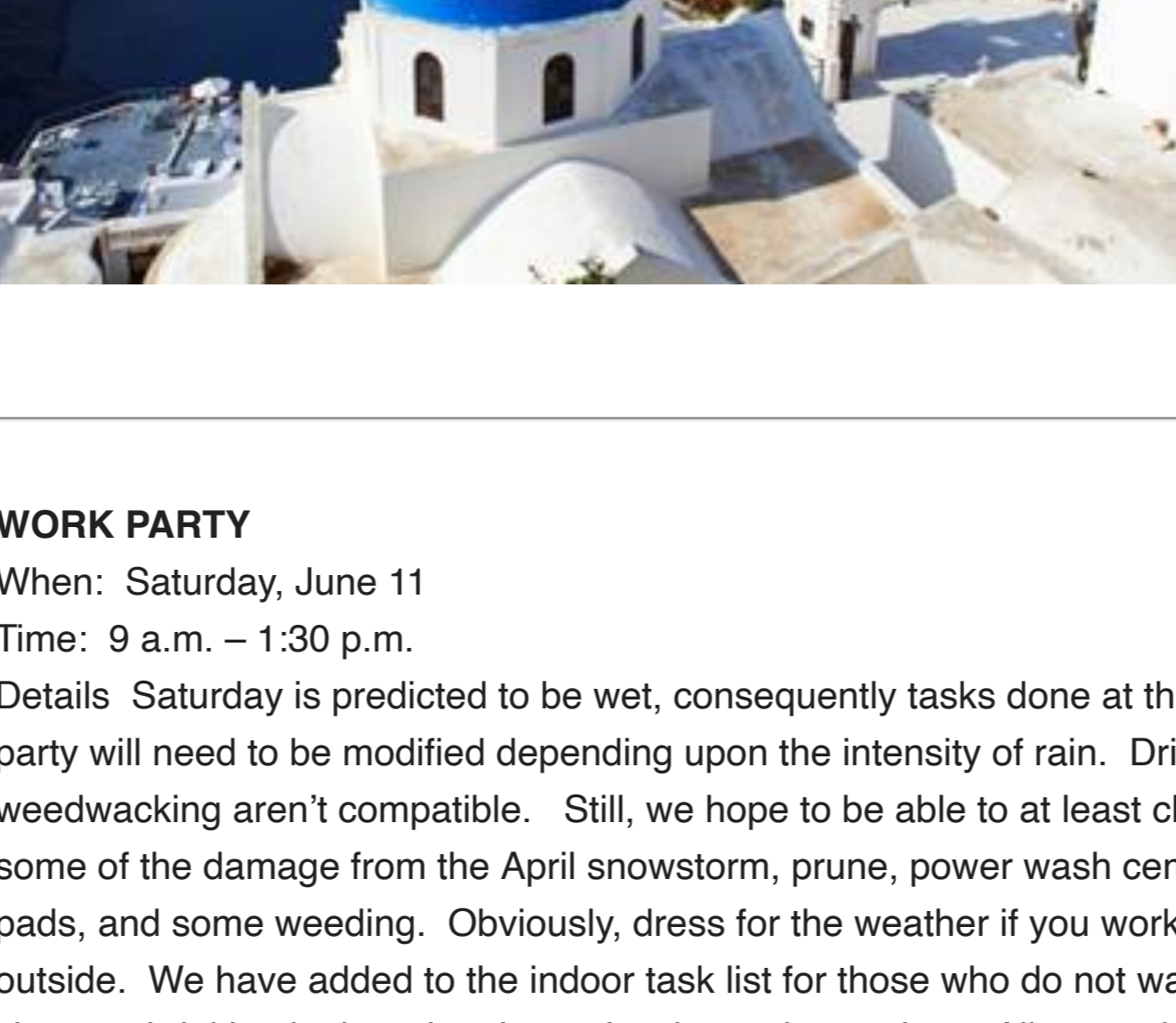

 - Learn about having your property assessed by your local fire department to receive recommendations on how to make your home more defensible against wildfires.  
 - Pick up information about evacuation protocols, when to evacuate, and preparing for evacuation,  
 - Pick up literature about pet and large animal preparedness, how to make a family plan,  
 how to reduce your risks.

**WEED CONTROL**  
 This is an excellent time to control noxious weeds. The ground is wet, so plants tend to pull much easier now. This is a particularly timely moment to pull garlic mustard, ivy, and Scots broom before they go to seed.

- **GOT SCOTS BROOM? BORROW A WEED WRENCH NOW**  
 Soon the bright yellow Scot broom will burst their seed pods, spreading seeds onto the ground. Before this happens, borrow a Weed Wrench from SRN to remove these noxious weeds. Once the seed burst out of the seed pods, they can be viable in the soil for decades! Yikes! Little plants can be easily pulled up by hand, but once established – borrow a Weed Wrench. Call Sen (503-621-3331) to borrow a medium or large size (located on Skyline near milepost 15). For the small size, call Laura on McNamee (503-407-7175). It is simple to use.

- Other Weed Wrench Uses:
- In general, the Weed Wrench will uproot any woody plant if the jaws fit around the stem.
  - It is trickier on multi-stem plants but not impossible.
  - It won't work on root suckers where the sapling you see above ground may look like it could be pulled, but it is actually growing from a large root from the mother tree and cannot be pulled. Thus it may be of some help with hawthorn and holly, but you may need to do some digging too.
  - It will work on some herbaceous plants if the stem is fibrous and tough enough so the roots pull out before the stem is crushed to the breaking point (burdock and some thistles for example).
  - It should not be used to pull steel fence posts and will not work on soft-stemmed plants or plants growing in a clump like pampas grass or bamboo.

- **ENGLISH IVY**  
 An excellent source of information about how to pull and control ivy is at <https://wmswcd.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/02/ivy-WEB.pdf>. Ideally, pull the whole root system up. At a minimum, if you have any flowering ivy, cut and dispose of the flowering part now before birds can distribute the seeds to other locations.

- **GARLIC MUSTARD**  
 It is almost the end of this spring's garlic mustard pulling opportunity. Soon its seed pods will burst, spreading many seeds. West Multnomah Soil & Water Conservation District and the City of Portland are again on the job of controlling this formidable enemy of our natural habitat. Again SRN, FPNA, and Skyline Grange encourage local residents to be involved by:

- learning how to identify this plant at [garlic\\_mustard\\_overview\\_srbgmcnec.pdf \(smpdx.org\)](#),
- monitoring their properties,
- pulling, bagging & disposing of plants according to protocol [Garlic Mustard - SRN \(smpdx.org\)](#),
- monitoring when walking our roadsides,
- scrubbing your footwear and bicycle wheels off when leaving a garlic mustard area,
- And roadside Walkers – look for garlic mustard plants while you are enjoying your walk

Skyline Grange again hosts a free disposal site for plants that you have pulled and are in a secure heavy-duty plastic bag. This disposal site is available through mid-June. When you bring bags, please enter your data on the provided data sheet at the site giving location pulled, approximate number, and any other helpful information. Skyline Grange is located at 11275 NW Skyline Blvd.

**BACKYARD BURN SEASON ENDS 6/15 - CALL BEFORE YOU BURN 503-259-1789**

Residential "backyard" outdoor burning is limited to approved burn dates and hours during the spring (March 1-June 15) and fall (October 1- December 15). This allows for limited outdoor burning of yard debris, leaves and tree trimmings in accordance with DEQ Rules and ODF rules.  
 a. Check the TVF&R Outdoor Burning Map at Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue Burn Restrictions ([arcgis.com](http://arcgis.com)) to see if your address is allowed residential backyard debris burning.  
 b. Next, if burning is allowed in your area, find out whether it is an approved burn day by calling TVF&R's Burn Message at 503-259-1789. Call before you burn!

**And don't forget those weed wrenches are available for loan from SRN.**

Borrow a tool to eliminate Scotch broom, holly and other woody shrubs, sapling trees easily. SRN will lend 3 sizes of Weed Wrench. Contact Sen 503.621.3331 for large and medium size (Skyline near mile marker 15). Contact Laura 503.407.7175 for small size (McNamee Rd.).
