BE AWARE OF AIR QUALITY & TAKE ACTION

- Compared to many other parts of the State, our air quality has been less affected by wildfires so far, but you should check our air quality frequently and take measures if it is unhealthy. Just google "air quality Portland OR" or go to www.lqaire.com or to www.airnow.gov. The AQI is divided into 6 categories. Each category corresponds to a different level of health concern.
- If air quality is poor, do the following:
 - Stay inside
 - Avoid strenuous exercising. If you exercise, only do so indoors
 - Have a supply of N95 or P100 masks marked with NOISH and learn how to use them. If you must go outside, wear one.
 - Reduce the smoke that enters your home.
- Close all windows and doors
- If you have an HVAC system with a fresh air intake, set the system to recirculate mode, or close the outdoor intake damper.
- Use a portable air cleaner or high efficiency filter to remove fine particles from the air. If you use a portable air cleaner, run it as often as possible on the highest fan speed.
- If you have an HVAC system with a high-efficiency filter installed, run the system's fan as often as possible to remove particles while the air quality is poor.
 - Air out your home by opening windows or the fresh air intake on your HVAC system when the air quality improves, even temporarily.

PROPOSAL The applicant completed the drilling of a new domestic well to support the Heritage Tract Dwelling approved via case #T2-2020-13584. Property owners within 750 feet of the subject property have the opportunity to appeal this action. If there is no appeal, the County may sign off on the building plans for the dwelling.
COMMENT PERIOD: Written comments will be accepted, if received by 4 pm on September 13, 2021. Comments should be directed toward approval criteria applicable to the request.
